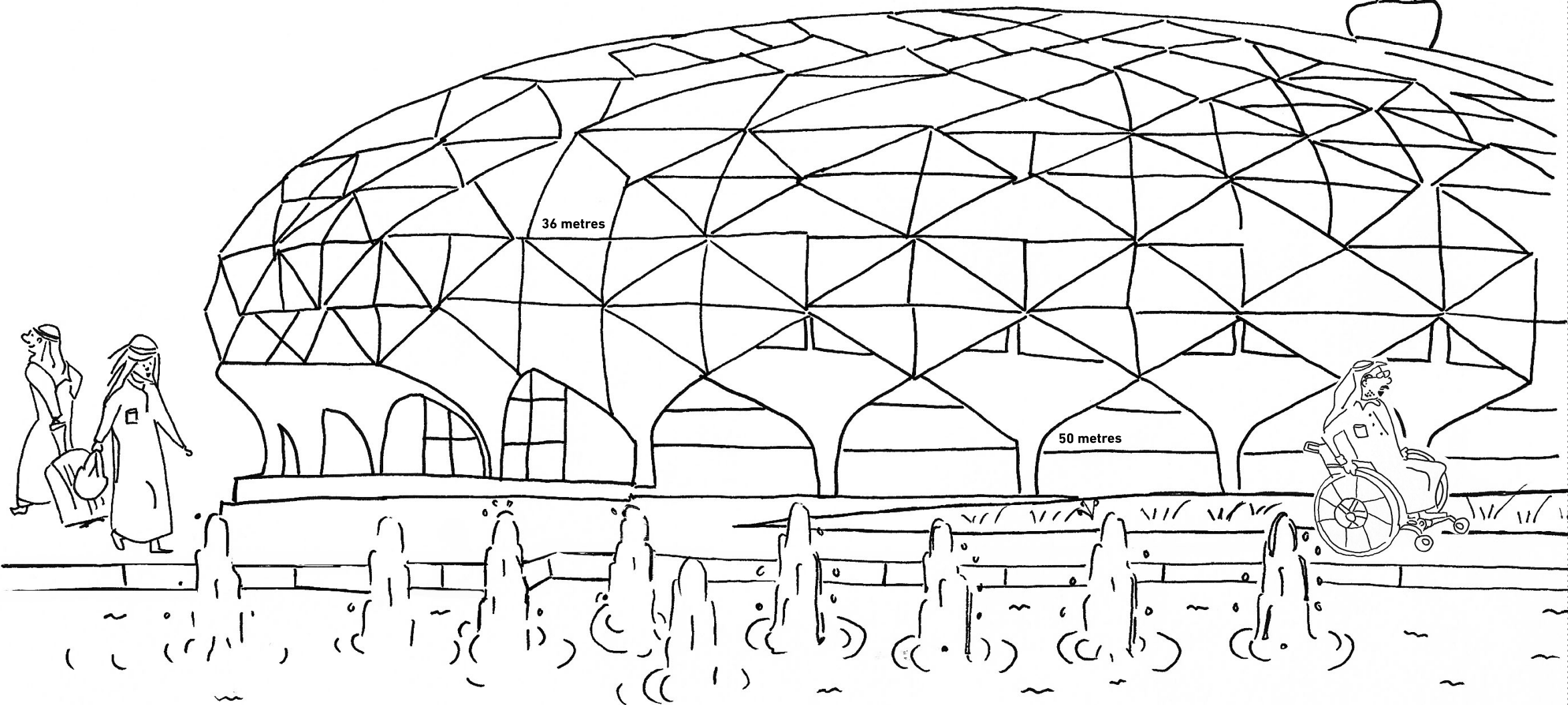
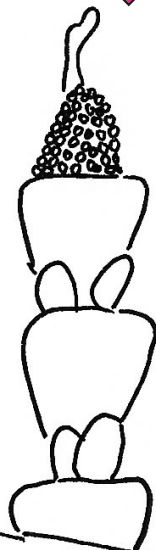

1600 individual pieces of glass  
make up the dome.

with 200,000 mosaic tiles and is  
illuminated by LED lights at night.

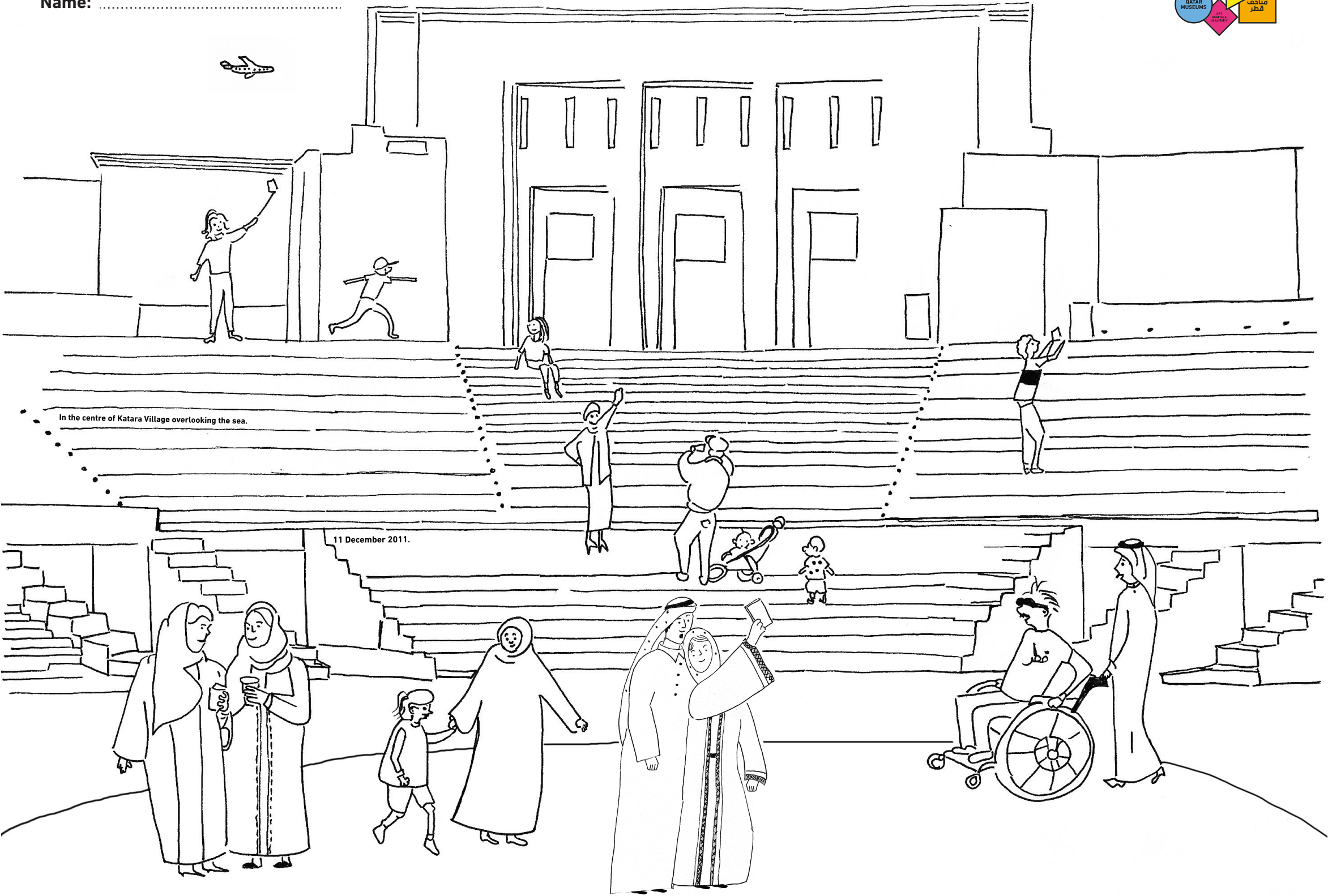
